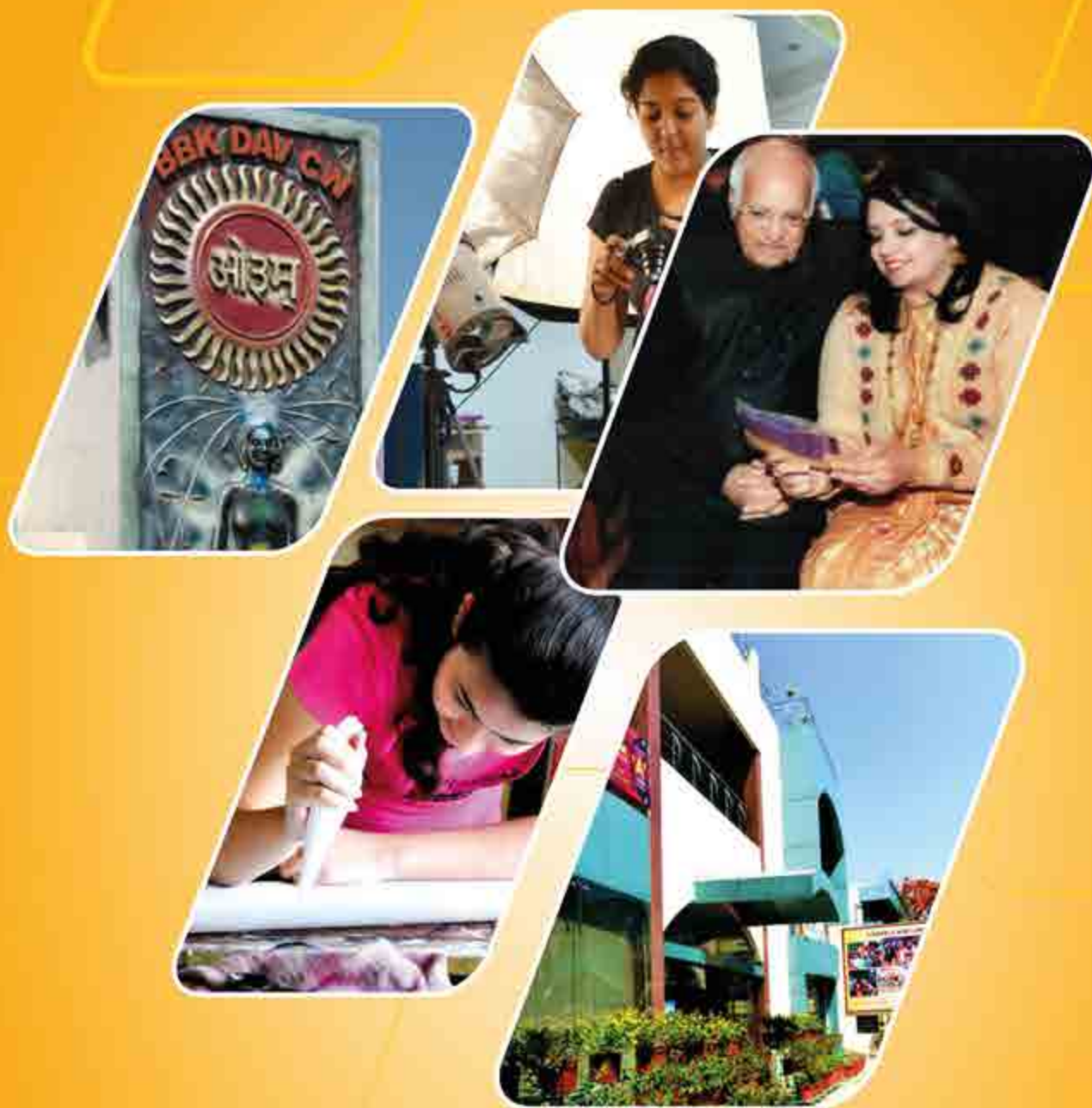

THE INSTITUTION

At a glorious 53, BBK DAV College for Women stands tall as a provider of Quality Higher Education on the national horizon. It was founded in the year 1967 under the aegis of DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi, with the avowed aim of spreading the benefits of education to women, synchronizing tradition with modernity. A multi faculty institution, that aims to blend professional & vocational education with traditional courses, it is an excellent model of what a women's college can do for women's development. The thrust of the college is on the highly innovative and efficient management of all its resources - human and infrastructural. The history of fifty years shows an endless desire to be in pace with vocation-oriented education and challenges of technology, communication & media. The college combines a commitment to teaching excellence with extensive sports and cultural opportunities. The academic thrust is on imparting in-depth knowledge of the subjects concerned and to develop critical abilities to enable the students to relate and use knowledge in real life situations. The co-academic and cultural activities are focused around inculcating a strong sense of commitment to nationalist, social & aesthetic values.

Nurtured by an ideal combination of facilities and facilitators, the college scholars, sports persons and artists have been winning the highest honours in their fields of interest. In this session, the college scholars won nearly 223 merit positions, including 56 First, 44 Second & 29 Third positions.

The college enjoys the rare honour of having given to the nation one Arjuna Awardee, one Olympian, one gold Medalist in Asian Games and scores of players of the international level in addition to 400 sports women of extraordinary ability to meet the national standards during the last five years. In the session 2019-20, two college players won name and fame at international level, namely Elangbam Chouba Devi, Cycling Player, won Gold Medal in (Individual Time Trial Event) 13th South Asian Games (SAF) at Kathmandu-Pokhara in Nepal from 1st to 10th Dec, 2019. She also won Gold Medal in Track Asia Cup (3 km Individual Pursuit) held in New Delhi from 9th to 11th Sept., 2019. Similarly, Jasjeet Kaur, Pencak Silat Player, won Bronze Medal in 2nd Malaysia Open International Silat Championship from 26th to 29th Sept., 2019 & 1st World Beach Pencak Silat Championship held at Patong Beach Phuket Thailand from 30th to 4th Oct, 2019.

The investment of the college in sports is more than Rs.2 Crore per year and it provides the latest equipment for all the 33 games of GNDU. In the Inter College competitions organized by Guru Nanak Dev University, our College participated in 30 games and got 28 positions out of which 12 Championships, 9 got 1st Runners-up Positions and 7 teams got 2nd Runners-up Positions. The college has made tremendous contribution to university sports, adding a major share in Guru Nanak Dev University's exceptional feat of winning Maulana Abul Kalam Azad All India Trophy for Sports. Continuing its winning streak, the college bagged the GNDU Overall General Sports Championship Trophy (2018-19) consecutively for the eighth time and also won runners-up Shaheed-E-Azam Bhagat Singh Overall General (Men & Women Combined) Sports Championship Trophy 2017-18. 52 outstanding players of the college received a huge amount worth Rs. 17,00,000 as prize money for their commendable performance. Two International Cyclists of the college, Ms. Elangbam Choaba Devi and Sushikala Durgaprasad Agashe and a Kayaking player Ms. Komal Bisht got maximum cash prize of Rs.2,90,000, Rs.85,000 and Rs.1,20,000 respectively among women players.

In all the fields of cultural activity, the college artists remain in the forefront. The College lifted the overall championship trophy in Zonal Youth Festival (A' Zone) of GNDU held from 3rd to 6th Nov, 2019 with a huge margin of 59 points. The College won the championship trophy by attaining 149 marks and securing 29 positions in 34 events. The college participants made their mark by winning 1st position in 21 events, 2nd positions in 5 events and 3rd position in 3 events.

The college also won the maximum no. of first positions as a single institution in the State Level Dera Baba Nanak Online Youth Festival organised by Govt. of Punjab as a part of the celebrations of the 550th Birth Anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. The festival was open to all the universities and colleges in Punjab. The college won five first positions and a third position. The winners were rewarded with cash prizes of Rs. 71,000 (group), Rs. 51,000 (solo) and Rs. 21,000 (Third Position – solo).

The college NCC and NSS units have been decorated with the highest honours. Our cadets have won the honour of commanding the NCC contingent at the Republic Day parade in New Delhi. In this session, NCC and NSS cadets of the college zealously participated in various state level and national level activities to create awareness in the society on the burning issues. The college takes genuine pride in pursuing its community service programmes and extensive activities most vigorously. To broaden the students' horizons, the college provides them abundant exposure through various seminars, guest lectures, exhibitions etc.

THE ACADEMIA

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

The college organizes an orientation programme, before the commencement of its academic session. This introduces the incoming students to various programmes, activities, facilities and the values of the institution.

LEADERSHIP SKILLS PROGRAMMES

The Head Girl, Assistant Head Girls, Presidents and Secretaries of Clubs and Societies, Class & Section Representatives are sensitized to values of responsibility, initiative and decision-making. Freshers' Contest, Valedictory Function and other functions of clubs and societies are organized by the students only.

THE PRAYER

The Prayer along with singing of the National Anthem is a regular feature of the college. Other than the invocations, the assembly is a means of communication with the students regarding policy matters, important functions/competitions and above all a time to disseminate meaningful matters of life and living. The relevance of important days and events like Youth Day, Women's Day, Rishi Bodh Day, Balmiki Day, Sant Ravi Dass Day etc. is reaffirmed

COMMUNITY SERVICE CELL

There is a very active Community Service Cell in the college, that helps to inculcate the spirit of service and civic values among the students. Visits to Orphanage and Old Age Home, Mental Hospital and institute for the Deaf and Dumb and to the Women Inmates of the Local Jail are organized from time to time. Several times, festivals are celebrated with the inmates. The students make collections in kind and cash to share with the inmates. Students are also sensitized to various national problems and are given training to serve society with a human touch in the time of emergency. In the recent past, they collected funds for the victims of Kargil War, Gujarat earthquake, Jammu & Kashmir refugees and Tsunami victims. The college participates in various community service programmes organized by Arya Samaj and DAV Institutions.

CAREER COUNSELLING CENTRE

During the time of admission, this cell helps the students by acquainting them with the programmes and courses available in the college and facilitates them in making decisions and choices for their future. The work of this cell is to offer insight, guidance and support to help students understand and manage different career issues.

GENDER SENSITIZATION

Under the aegis of WEF (Women Empowerment Forum), the college sensitizes women about their status and identity, coping strategies for their dual role and to become more self-reliant. The forum through lectures by women of eminence, tries to lift women out of the submissive/ subordinator's image and prepares them to live with dignity, facing the challenges of the patriarchal system.

INTERNATIONAL LINKAGES

The college has taken the initiative of forging ties with international institutes for educational & cultural exchanges and sharing of know-how. It has linkages with key global educational organizations like WCCI (World Council of Curriculum &

Instructions), WEF (World Education Foundation), Kent County Council, Technology College, Northfleet; Hextable School and World Punjabi Congress, Pakistan.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Spread over an area of 65,000 sq. yards, the college campus is modern, attractive and well-equipped for comfort, convenience and academic pursuits. This campus offers a large number of special opportunities for students. Apart from the lecture rooms, it has fully furnished Computer Labs, Music Rooms, Home Science & Fashion Designing Laboratories, Design Labs, Science Labs, Geography, Travel Tourism and Psychology Labs, Studios for Fine Arts, Commercial Art, Photography and Design. Separate building of design has come up with Textile Lab, Fashion Lab, Interiors Lab, Studios, Shoppe, Dark Room, Video Production Studio, Audio Production Studio, Electronics Lab, Still Photography Lab & Studio, Art Galleries, Multimedia Lab, Jewellery Studio & Manufacturing Lab, Virtual Library, Seminar Room & Open Air Theatre, Hi-tech Language Lab & Aviation Lab & Aesthetically Designed Cosmetology Lab.

The college is equipped with learning facilitators & gadgets ranging from Multimedia Projectors, Slide Projectors, Xerox Machines, TV, DVD & Audio Players, Smart Boards and learning resources. In order to meet the demands of Computer & IT related courses, the college has a Techno Centre with eighteen state-of-the-art computer labs interconnected through Local Area Network with optical fibre backbone. The Network Resource Centre is equipped with Windows Servers, pfSense firewall/gateway/router, licensed software and a wide range of latest gadgets. The campus has around 450 computers with Internet facility and latest printers, scanners, configurations to meet the needs of the students. The internet is available for 24 hours in all the labs and departments. The college offers Central Computing Facility to the faculty and the students to collect teaching learning resources. For conferencing, seminars, symposia & board meetings, the college has air-conditioned seminar rooms.

The college offers hostel accommodation to 500 students with all the ultra modern amenities, lush green lawns and a peaceful atmosphere, conducive for studies. The college offers a well-equipped multi storey high-tech, computerized and air-conditioned Library. Housed in an imposing, well-lit and ventilated building, it is the hub of activity all through the year. With 70,990 books, 31,35,000+ NList e-books, 53 national & international print journals and 6000+ NList e-journals, 117 magazines and 18 newspapers, the fully computerized library functions on open access system, augmented by reprographics facility. It has commodious reading rooms, exclusively for members of Scholars Club, for Honours and Postgraduate students and for the faculty. Every year the college spends lacs of rupees on books and journals, this being an area of top priority for the college. Subsidized photostat service is available to the members of the staff and the students of the college. The silver jubilee AUDITORIUM - URVI, with a seating capacity of 1200 is the centre of academic, co-academic and cultural activities like conferences, orientation camps, face-to-face shows, annual functions.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The SPORTS COMPLEX which is an impressive focal point of the players' activities, has facilities such as a Badminton Hall, Yoga Hall, Table-Tennis Hall, Judo Hall, Gymnastics Hall, Weightlifting Hall, Counselling Room, Change Room for players, offices for teachers and coaches, Sports Store-Rooms and Exhibition Hall, NCC Room, NSS Room and others.

In the beautifully designed Shri Mohan Lal Arora YAJYASHALA, Havan is performed daily at 8:30 am, not only to purify the atmosphere but also to make the students aware of the Vedic Culture, our rich tradition and heritage. A multi-tiered parking block has also come up. The STADIUM with a seating capacity of 1,000 has also been constructed in addition to GYMNASIUM, MEDIA HOUSE, VIRTUAL LIBRARY, BIOINFORMATICS LAB and AVIATION LAB, A MULTI-ACTIVITY COMMON ROOM for students and a separate block for Music & Dance have been constructed. A separate block for the PG Department of Commerce has also come up. The Administrative Block of the college is refurbished and refurnished regularly to add to the impressive infrastructure of the college.

PARENTS MUST ENSURE THAT

Their ward attends at least 75% of the lectures delivered. They are supposed to check lecture shortage from the college office, at the end of each term.

Their ward regularly visits the library.

Their ward reads all the notices/ circulars put up at the Information Centre.

PARENTS ARE ADVISED TO KEEP A STRICT CONTROL ON THE POCKET MONEY GIVEN TO THEIR WARD.

The parents & the students are required to go through the Prospectus carefully before signing the Admission Form. Once the form is signed, the total responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall lie upon the parents and the students and they shall be bound by the same.

Attendance in the HOUSE TESTS conducted by the college is compulsory and the student must attain the required pass percentage of marks. The college will take strict disciplinary action against a student, who is absent in the House Tests. However, the Principal may suspend punitive action in extraordinary circumstances.

PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR TRANSPORT ARRANGEMENTS

The college is located in the heart of the city. Public transport is easily available from neighbouring villages. However, college will not be held responsible for any transport arrangement made by parents/ students.

STUDENTS SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE CAMPUS BEFORE 12 NOON.

ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

The students are required to fulfill the following eligibility conditions for appearing in the final examinations of GNDU.

- Get 25 percent marks in aggregate of all the subjects or 35 percent marks in each subject in the House Test.
- Attend 75 percent of the total lectures delivered in each of the subjects taken by them, including theory and practical. Condonation of shortage of lectures, up to 15 percent of lectures attended, is Principal's discretion and not a student's right.
- Clear all the dues of the college.

In case they fail to fulfill any of these conditions, they shall be detained from appearing in the final examinations of GNDU. It is the responsibility of the students to apprise their parents of all the rules and regulations.

As per the directions of the High Court, students should not travel in any unsafe vehicle like truck/tractor in their own interest. They are further advised to strictly observe traffic rules & wear helmets.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Always carry your IDENTITY CARD, while in the college. No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the identity card. Its loss shall entail heavy penalty besides the cost of new Identity Card.

Come to the college in proper uniform on Mondays. Uniform on Mondays is white dupatta, shirt and salwar. Design— round neck, straight fitting, half sleeves. Bottle green pullover/ cardigan along with the uniform is to be strictly adhered to, in winters.

Wear decent dresses during the rest of the week. Suits or trousers with decent tops are allowed. Half pants, shorts, capris, sleeveless and short tops are not allowed.

Don't litter the campus. Eatables are not allowed in the academic area and the auditorium.

Don't scribble on the walls & the college property.

Rush for the assembly as soon as the bell rings.

Don't carry MOBILE PHONES in the college. Students using mobile phones in the college campus will be penalized and strict action will be taken.

Visit the Information Centre daily and read all the notices.

Maintain perfect silence in corridors.

Attend 'HAVAN', as and when notified. A heavy fine (Rs.50 per day) will be levied for each absence.

Don't honk the horn in the campus.

Park your vehicles in proper parking lot and do not sit on the parked vehicles.

Alight from the car, a little away from the main gate, if somebody comes to drop you, to allow smooth flow of traffic.

Avoid keeping heavy cash & jewellery in your bag.

Don't indulge in ragging. RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED AND PUNISHABLE BY LAW.

Switch off the fans and lights while leaving the classrooms. Be REGULAR & PUNCTUAL in classes.

Make use of your free time in academic/co-curricular pursuits.

Do not pluck flowers.

Any student found guilty of misbehaviour/ disobedience shall be rusticated from the college.

Leave Rules

- A student should apply for leave from the college when it is absolutely necessary, on the printed form available from the college book shop.
- Nature and reason of leave and days on which it is required must be stated clearly in the leave form.
- Leave application must be endorsed by father/guardian of the student or by the Hostel Superintendent, in case of a boarder.
- All leaves other than for personal illness, duty, one's own marriage are regarded as casual.
- A student will be allowed only 10 casual leaves i.e. 5 in each semester. Even if leave beyond 10 days has been granted, excess leave will be automatically cancelled.
- Leave for a part of a day will be counted as full day for calculation of total leave.
- Sanctioning authority for leave up to 3 days is the teacher of General English and any leave for more than 3 days has to be got sanctioned from the principal/or her nominee.
- In case of long, serious illness or any accident, the Principal must be informed by the parents of the wards, along with a medical certificate on the day of its occurrence. It must be borne in mind that medical leave due to serious illness shall be considered towards condonation on merit of the case. ROUTINE MEDICAL CERTIFICATE SHALL NOT BE ENTERTAINED.
- No leave application during the House Tests will be entertained by anyone except Dean, Academics.

RAGGING IS A MENACE: CURB IT COMPLETELY

Ragging is banned in the college. The college has adopted the UGC regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 as well as the directions of the Hon'ble Apex Court.

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING?

Any disorderly conduct whether by words, spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing or mistreating, mishandling any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension in fresher or junior students or asking other students to do an act or perform something which students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of the fresher or the junior student.

Note : If a student is found guilty of ragging, she is liable to be punished appropriately including expulsion from the institution and /or imprisonment up to 3 years and / or a fine of Rs.25,000. The punishment may also include

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS 2020-21

a) Those students who have passed the lower examination from some other board/university (other than Punjab University, Punjabi University and Punjab School Education Board) will have to obtain eligibility certificate from Guru Nanak Dev University within one month of admission.

b) Students have to fill eligibility form and submit in office with original DMC and migration certificate at the time of admission

a) Migration certificate from the university/board concerned. (A student can apply for eligibility certificate even if she has not received migration certificate so far). Inter-college migration certificate is essentially required for the students migrating from any other college of GNDU.

b) Attested copy of entrance test card of selection list. (Only for those courses/classes where admission is based on entrance test).

c) Category certificate issued by Gazetted Officer (like SC/ST/BC) and Punjab Domicile Certificate/Residence Certificate.

Those students who have passed the lower examination from Punjabi/Punjab University or PSEB are exempted from obtaining eligibility certificate, but they have to submit all the above-mentioned original documents by the given dates.

Those students who have passed the lower examination i.e.

intermediate from Bihar Intermediate Education Council, Patna will have to submit Admit Card, Transfer/Character Certificate duly attested by DEO, from the college/school, issued by council, other than the above-mentioned certificates.

Those students who have passed SSC Part-II from National Open School, New Delhi, in four subjects (including English) and which is cleared within two years after matriculation, can be given provisional admission in BA/B Sc (Pass Courses). Such students will have to clear the remaining fifth subject within a particular group.

Syndicate in its meeting on 24-02-1997 has passed through para 89 - that the students who obtained the bachelor's degree before 1991 in the old (14 year) stream will be treated at par with (10+2+3) stream in pursuance of higher courses.

Students coming from other states will be allowed to take up Punjab History & Culture in lieu of General Punjabi as per rules given in 33(6) of University calendar. For clarification, contact college office.

Foreign students would be given admission only if they have student visa, not on the basis of any other visa. They will have to submit a recognition certificate of the examination passed from Association of Indian Universities, Kotla Marg, New Delhi. This is mandatory for obtaining eligibility certificate. They will have to submit complete documents, including the details of student visa.

The information regarding boards/universities recognized by GNDU may be obtained from the college office.

Admission Procedure

Note:

After University's odd semester examinations the students must take admission immediately in even semester without waiting for their results.

Parents are required to read the Prospectus before signing the form.

Once the form is signed, the total responsibility of having read the rules and regulations, shall lie upon them.

The student should -Purchase the Prospectus and read it carefully. Fill the form neatly and completely.

Get it signed from her parents/guardian.

Get it checked from the Subject Verification Board.

Face interview conducted by the admission board for seeking admission.

Subjects will be given on FIRST COME FIRST SERVED CUM MERIT basis, and as per availability.

Students who have been on the rolls in the previous year will lose their claim, on late arrival.

Admitted students will pay the fee at the fee counter on the same day and submit the form at the same counter.

In case of delay in the payment of fees, the form will need re-validation by the incharge of Admission Board.

Subjects taken may be changed the next day, provided seats are available.

Submit the photographs in the office to collect the identity card. Students are required to deposit 4 coloured photographs.

It is mandatory for all students to get themselves enrolled online also (as per dates prescribed by GNDU).

Documents Needed at the Time of Admission

The following certificates should be produced at the time of interview/admission.

Original Certificates and Marks Sheet of the lower examination passed. Attach attested photocopies with the Admission Form.

Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended (for new students only).

Scheduled Caste/ Tribe/ Backward Class students must attach certificates from the competent authority; outstanding players, speakers, singers, dancers, fine artists and best-in-acting, require supporting certificates.

Original Migration Certificates & Eligibility Certificate issued by GNDU to students who have passed lower examination from Board/ University other than Punjab Board/ GNDU.

Provisional admission without submission of required certificates may be given at the risk of the students, in rare circumstances.

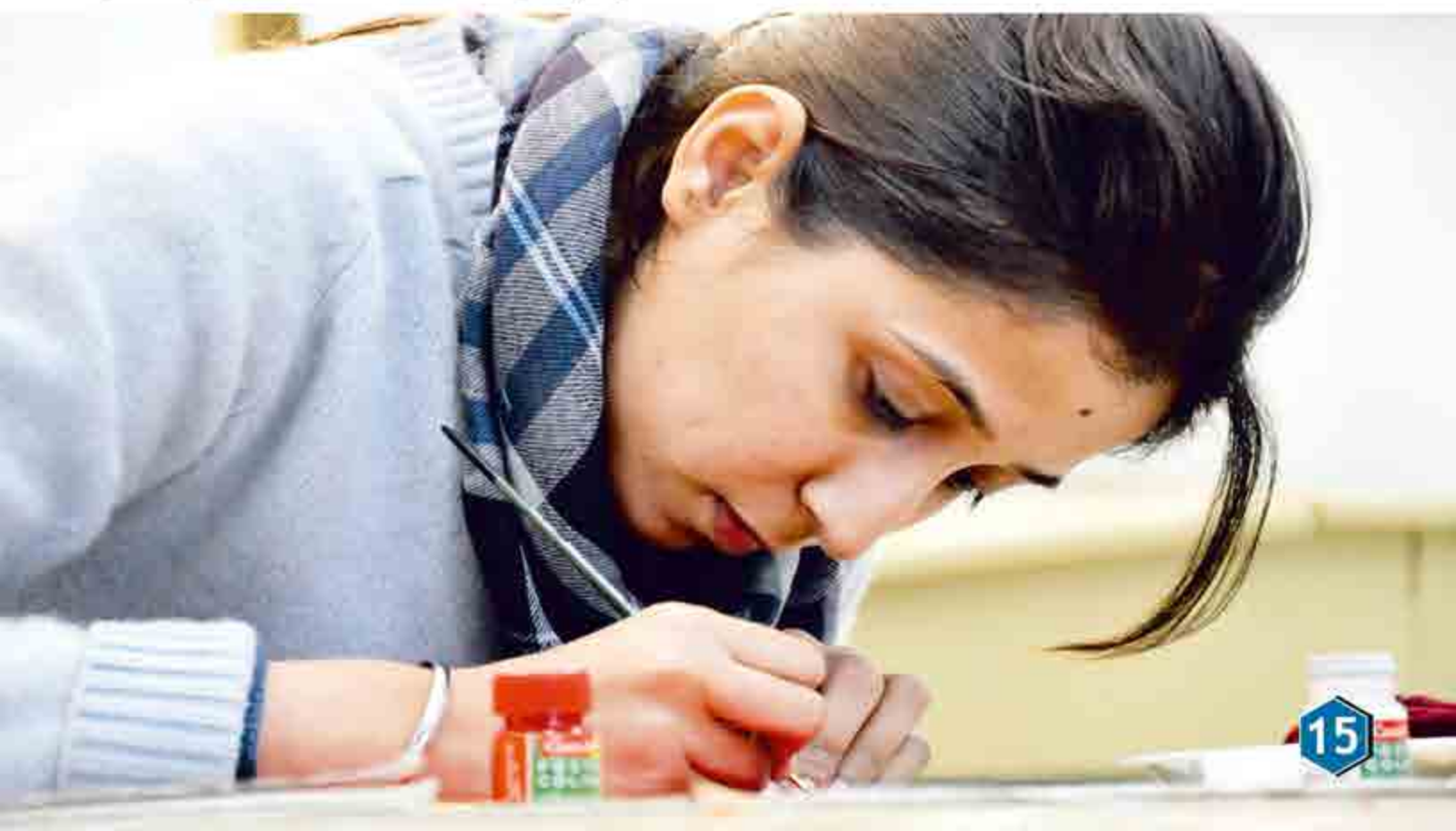

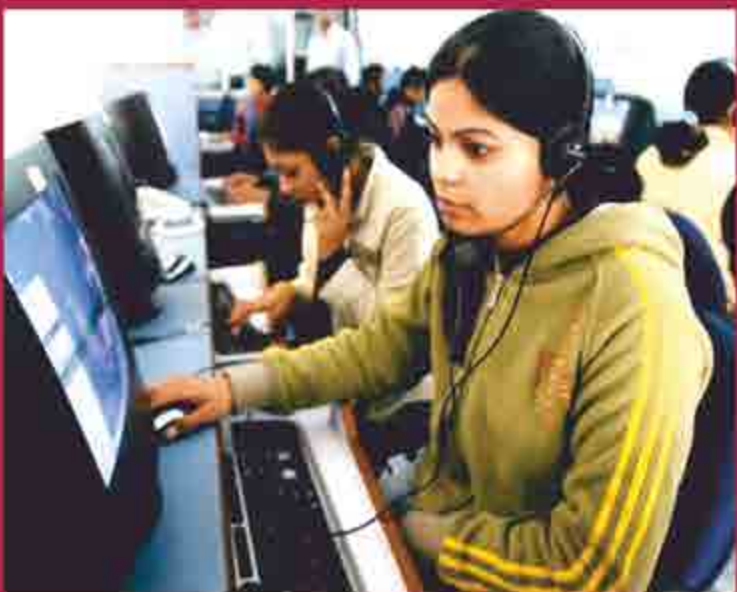

Common Ordinances under semester system for Undergraduate, Postgraduate Courses, Postgraduate Diploma, Advanced Diploma and Certificate courses.

1. Eligibility for Admission and duration of the courses

The eligibility and duration of the courses shall be prescribed by the University from time to time. Admission to Semester I shall be open to a candidate who has passed, not less than one academic year previously, 10+2 of Punjab School Education Board / State Board / CBSE / ICSE.

2. Fee

Every candidate shall pay such fee to the institution under jurisdiction of the University as the syndicate may prescribe from time to time.

3. Scheme of Instruction-Examination

For each examination every student admitted to the course under the semester system must be on the rolls of the institution and shall send her admission form and fees for the examination through the Principal/Head of the Institution accompanied by the following certificates:

- a) Of having attended at least 75% of the total number of lectures delivered in each theory and practical course separately. If in a particular semester, a student falls short of attendance in a maximum of two courses, she would be permitted to appear in the semester examination of the papers in which she fulfils the attendance requirements. The course in which the student does not fulfil the minimum attendance requirements, she shall not be permitted to appear in the semester examination of such course and shall be declared as having failed in such course. A student who is falling short of attendance in maximum of two courses, shall be required to attend the minimum number of lectures which were falling short, during next year when the courses are offered.
- b) Of having good moral character.
- c) The syllabi, courses of reading and regulations for the courses shall be notified by the University from time to time and shall be deemed to constitute integral part of ordinances. Course evaluation under the semester system of evaluation shall be done on marks basis. If a course has both the theory and practical components, the student will be required to pass both the components, separately. However, if the student fails in theory, but qualifies in practical examination of that course, she will be required to clear the theory paper only, and vice-versa.

4) Carry on system for various semester examinations

- I. Course having two semester duration:
 - a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b. In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of two semester(One year) she shall be given two consecutive semesters(one year) more to pass
- II. Courses having four semester duration:
 - a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student form first semester to second semester.
 - b. However, the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
 - c. There shall be no conditions for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
 - d. In case a student fails to pass all the course/papers within a period of four semesters (two years), she shall be given four consecutive semesters (two years) more to pass.
- III. Courses having six semester duration:
 - a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b. However, the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
 - c. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
 - d. However, a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of first four semesters.
 - e. After a period of six semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.
- IV. Courses having eight semester duration:
 - a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b. A student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 50% coures/papers from third semester to fourth semester.
 - c. A student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if she has passed 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
 - d. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from fifth semester to sixth semester.
 - e. However, a student shall be promoted to seventh semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of first six

semesters.

- f. After a period of eight semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

Note:1 No special chance or exemption shall be allowed beyond what is stated in the above ordinances.

Note:2 Failed students shall appear in the examination in the regular semester examinations next year .i. e reappear of examination for an odd semester shall be conducted along with the next odd semester, and even semester along with the next even semester and there shall be no special supplementary examinations.

Note:3 If 50% of the course /papers required to pass involve a fraction, the fraction of the course/ paper will be treated as a full course. For example, if in a year there are 13 courses in two semesters, the candidate will be required to pass minimum of 7 courses/ papers.

- 5) The pass marks for a course (paper) shall be 35% at Bachelors degree level, certificate, diploma, advanced diploma and PG Diploma levels. The pass marks for a course shall be 40% at post graduate degree level. Pass marks in aggregate of all the courses shall be 40%. Re-evaluation shall be allowed as per ordinances.
If a candidate obtains less than 40% marks in aggregate at the end of the final semester/year of her course but is passed in all individual papers, the result of such a candidate shall be declared as 'fail' and she shall be required to improve her score in one or more papers in any of the semesters/year so as to obtain a minimum 40% marks in aggregate to pass the examination.
- 6) The medium of instructions shall be as already existing in the ordinances.
- 7) Grace marks will be allowed as per university ordinances.
- 8) Maximum time allowed to pass a course is given below:

- 9) Regular students admitted to a course shall register/ enroll themselves with the university in the very first semester of their admission and pay prescribed fee to the college/ University. Direct admission to second semester is not allowed.

RULES

NCC now is of three years duration & the cadets have to attend one camp for B Certificate Exam and two camps for C certificate. Students enrolled under NCC shall be required to attend 40 parades in a session, as per schedule, notified by the college. NCC cadets must collect their uniform from the NCC store at the beginning of the session and attend the parades regularly.

INCENTIVES & WEIGHTAGE

The college provides liberal fee concessions and cash awards to outstanding NCC cadets, other than the following incentives:

A weightage of 5 percent on the aggregate marks is given in Nursing Courses and B. Ed.

FINANCIAL AID FOR SCHEDULED CASTE/BACKWARD CLASS STUDENTS

No fees and funds would be charged from the students of scheduled caste category as part of Post Matric Scholarship Scheme (conditions apply). According to the provision of the scheme, only two children of the same parents/ guardians are entitled to receive scholarships. In case two children of the same family have already availed of the scholarship, the third is not eligible to receive the scholarship for all times to come, in case of scheduled caste.

Special scholarships for girl students under the Government of India Post Matric Scholarship Scheme, are available to those scheduled caste/tribe students who are permanently settled in Punjab State and are pursuing post matriculation studies. The annual family income from all the sources should not exceed Rs.2,50,000 in any case. Backward Class Stipend is given to the student, whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs.1,00,000.

Note: A student belonging to this category should have a current online account in the bank as the fees / funds shall be paid through bank account by the State Development Board.

STIPEND TO THE WARDS OF THE ARMED FORCES

The prescribed forms are available in the office of the District Sainik Welfare Officer. The applications complete in all respects are to be forwarded through the head of the institution. The amount of the stipend will be given to the students on receiving the same from the office concerned. EDUCATIONAL CONCESSIONS to the wards of officers & men of the Armed Forces killed/ disabled during hostilities. The college gives a concession to the tune of Rs.1,000 (one time) and Rs.100 per month to the wards of JCO and below the rank of JCO. The concession is Rs.2,000 (one time) for the professional courses.
